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

50 Years Ago: July 1960

- President: N. Scanlan.
- Track Laying Hint by **Stan Filsell**:

When laying track made from Peco loose rail, it is preferable to bend your rails to a curve as near as possible to their fixed position, and this is not particularly accurate if done through the fingers. The following method has been found successful.

For an 18" curve use a circle of approximately 8¹/₂" diameter. Mum's cake or biscuit tin might do. Get somebody to hold the tin firmly, upside down, and then with the rail also upside down hold one end firmly against the rim while you sweep the rest of the rail around the rim with your fingers.

Normally, the rail comes out with a nice even curve and it lies flat with no twist. A 5 gallon kerosene tin with an 11" diameter would give a suitable curve for 24" radius.

- Standardization of the Adelaide Crystal Brook line will not be completed until September. The Adelaide – Crystal Brook section is part of a \$63 million project to link S.A. with the standard gauge lines to Sydney, Perth and Alice Springs. As part of the \$63 million project, a \$5 million railway station will be built at Keswick.
- All A.N.R. passenger traffic would in future be handled at the new centre. Keswick was chosen because it's accessible to the city and suburbs and would link with the existing rail service. [That's a joke!]
- Although the standard gauge line would extend into the Mile End goods yard, new freight handling facilities would be built at Islington.

# The Principia of the Manifestation and Mystique of Baseboard and Turnout Constructions – or – Soddit's Law

Tim Leach

In my adventure to build my first layout – and it will be moderately large with all complex stuff – I am keeping a journal. I thought I would share a piece of science I have been working on. To date it is the only formula that complies with 100% of my recorded observations.

The ratio of baseboard space free of support cross members or framework is inversely proportional to the square of the number of point motors that has to be cut into the baseboard. (Apologies to Sir Isaac.)

For the non qualified, non-school teachers or non-engineers this translates into:

Every time a point motor has to be cut into a baseboard there is a cross member or part of the frame in the way. Where there is no need for a point motor, there is no need for a cross member or bit of framework, and the bigger the base board makes the problem worse.

The layout was built by *Toowoomba Trains* and *Toys*. It took eight people 13 weeks to build it.






