

- Water has been reproduced on the club layout for the first time.

### 40 Years Ago: March 1971

- The S.A.R. uses 1.5 million dogspikes each year, costing 7¢ each.
- The initial trials of the new Goodwin Alco 442 class locos in N.S.W. have not been entirely successful.





Those who attended the January General Meeting for 2011 were treated to a fine display of multiple copies of a brand new model, the recently released Ixion Models On30 "Coffee Pot" Steam Rail Motor.

No less than half a dozen variants of the Railmotor were displayed, two each from both Barrie and Paul Mackinnon alone! Several other SARMA members have also purchased the model and reports have been very favourable regarding performance, detailing and features – they even have space for a DCC sound/speaker system! Particularly worth noting are the tiny LED oil lamps on the front and rear of the Rail Motor, the internal lighting in the carriage roof and the superb detail of the cramped valve gear arrangement on the 2-2-0 wheelset.

The models currently available represent both variants of the Railmotors. No. 1, famous as the Pichi Richi Railway's "Coffee Pot" which is perhaps the only original surviving Steam Railmotor. (As a footnote, the GWR Society based in Didcot have almost completed work on their new-build standard gauge GWR Railmotor, reconverted from an auto coach!) The No. 2 variant is much lesser known; its difference is having a driver's compartment at the carriage end also, allowing it to be used in both directions without a turntable. Reportedly it operated around the Mt Gambier line (If I heard correctly! It is also definitely a real loco, to correct one review on a website listing the No. 2 version as a "mighthave been"...).

This is the second locomotive release Ixion Models has brought out. The first is

completely un-related, being an N Scale Great Western engine! The model of the 4-6-0 'Manor' has received good reviews and has been credited with filling a major gap in Great Western Railway N Scale locos, as the only other big engines for that railway are elderly Graham Farish ones nowhere near current standards. The company is also concentrating on a second GWR engine for its next release, the 63xx mogul.

The "Coffee Pot" has been given a good reception by overseas modellers, interestingly with demand being higher for the lesser known double cab variant! A ready-to-run Steam Railmotor of any type in any scale is incredibly rare (if at all!), and both the character and the usefulness of such an engine on Narrow Gauge layouts has clearly won it a number of fans, no doubt helped by the prototype's fame, courtesy of its survival and use on the PRR.

While Narrow Gauge models are not part of everyone's taste or fit into their scheme it cannot be denied that the "Coffee Pot" is a significant release: a modern ready-to-run SAR/CR steam engine whose success not only raises the profile for models of these lines and fills a significant, highly useful gap; but may perhaps ensure the eventual release of other popular Australian locomotives which have hitherto been the domain of scratch or kit builders. I am very keen to hear of the company's plans for further releases, and judging from the display fellow SARMA members are too – or perhaps they are keen to get on the real thing once it is fresh from overhaul!



The SAR had these coaling facilities located at 5 locations around the State and were to be found in service areas with the usual loco requirements. They were located at Mt Gambier, Naracoorte, Bordertown, Terowie and Cockburn. Of course there is always an exception, because the Bordertown unit was located over the main line on the Serviceton side of the Bordertown station. This was because coal was not available for SAR engines at Serviceton. The loading of coal into this unit differed from the other units because of the track layout.

I had only seen photos of these, so when an article appeared in the AMRM for Sept/Oct 1978 I decided that one on the layout would look good. I already had a Wallaroo (150 ton capacity) on the layout and was in the process of building a 15 ton timber style AMRM March/April 1970, examples being at Eudunda & Snowtown.

However it has taken me 30 years to finally get around to building the 45 ton version, and then building two, one for my new layout and one for the original layout which is now at Hugh's place.

I have never had a lot of success building with styrene sheet or shapes and although using Northeastern wood shapes would have been possible it would still look like wood, so brass shapes were the next best. This would give the smooth appearance of steel and could be soldered together which saves waiting for glue to dry and making other parts and then fitting them together.

So having sorted the construction material out it was a matter of working out sizes of "I" beams, channel and angle to use so it was back to the plan and the photos I had of Terowie and Cockburn. Construction followed along normal building lines as there were walkways and the like which needed to be put in as you went because it was difficult to get them in later, as I found out a couple of times.

The bin was made first using 10 thou brass sheet cut, bent and soldered together; the angle bracing and channel was then added. I made a jig to hold the channel for the legs the correct distance apart; this also helped with positioning of the bracing. Once these were finished they were attached to the bin. That was the easy part. The next task was the top structure and the track for the bucket to travel on from under the adjoining track taking the coal to the top of the bin, the track for the counterweight on the opposite side, and the pulley wheels. It was then time to understand how the whole thing worked, so it was a case of looking at the plans and photos to see where all the ropes went and what part they played. Another drawing was done of the shape of the coal bucket track. It was then a matter of attaching the supports for this off the legs and then the track for the counterweight. The pulley wheel at the top took some thought as to what to use and how to make it looked right. In the end used Model Etch 4 spoke hand brake wheels soldered together with the spokes set out to give me 8 spokes. The counterweight, coal bucket, walkways, handrails and ladders were made and put in place.

Attention then turned to the unloading hopper, safety fence and winch house. These were fairly straight forward and followed a normal construction method. Various materials were used, these being styrene I-beam to carry the rail over the hopper, NE concrete form board for the wall, and dressmaking tulle for the chain wire safety fence. The winch house was balsa with corrugated card and Campbell windows and doors.

The Oil Tank was made entirely referring to photos and again was made with brass. I made a dual tank similar to the Mile End loco depot one in the late 60s using NE timber for the frame and brass tanks. Over the years it had suffered a bit of damage so a new one

was made and together with 2 single tank type as was used at Cockburn.

Painting of course was what shade of black did you want, but looking at photos and knowing the colours the Railways used for structures helped so the bottoms of the supports were painted white, then red was applied above this. The whole was then painted using weathered black with a light application over the red and white so it was lost but still being able to pick out the red/

white. The winch house was silver with thinned rust and black brush over till an effect was achieved.

The whole project to make the display model took approximately 250 hours. The second ones took just as long so there was no advantage in bulk building.

It was a good project and I am sorry it wasn't done sooner but that's life.



- the electrification of the entire suburban rail system."




