




MAY CLUBROOM LAYOUT REPORT

DEAN SCHLUTER

Sorry but I was too late returning from my latest trip away to present the layout report for April. While I was away the Tuesday team started working on the Southern peninsular upper level containing the End station SOUTH END. This station has five turnouts (points) along the front edge of the base board and will obstruct clear access to the lower level tracks, so we have had to resort to PECO point machines with the PECO single pole frog switch and because there is no signal switching on these five turnouts we can get away with the single switch. So, it looks like someone has to build a CD power supply for the five PECO's.

I now should get back into the harness and get some signal wiring done so that some scenery can be finished at the back of the layout. Also, we have some Tuesday workers painting rails and laying ballast. The ballast is swimming pool filter sand sifted to the correct size and stained with Indian Ink. We are using this as it is free from my Son In-law, and we will need lots of it. When planting signals around the layout there are several spots where dual tracks are involved that the signals do not clear the NMRA gauge this is a problem that will require a cantilever signal bridge. I could not find a plan for these, only a not too clear photo shown below and use of the NMRA clearance gauge to draw the plan, I have made one out of brass tubing and I hope we have a couple of volunteers to make more. The alternative is to raise signal target head higher to clear the gauge, which is allowable in some cases. David Jameson has been busy creating control panels.

A SARMA TRIP TO PORT PIRIE, 1982

Graham kindly sent in these shots from his first trip with the club on 10th-11th September 1982, the weekend of the last Broad Gauge steam train to Port Pirie hauled by 520 on an ARHS special. His shots see the Australian National Railways still in the transitional period with the SAR and Commonwealth Railways disels still mostly untouched apart from the ANR lettering or words. See Tony Sitter's excellent *SARMA ON TOUR* book for a full write up of this trip. Graham apologises for the quality as they were taken with a Kodak Instamatic Camera– he need not so as these shots very valuable for anyone wishing to get a flavour of the motive power found in Port Pirie during the gauge changeover.



Two ex SAR locos as part of the Standard gauge fleet in Port Pirie Yard. 601 sports Mustard pot livery and 863 is in the maroon and silver livery. Australian National painted three SG 830s in Maroon and Silver though that worn by 859/ 862 is not the same as that shown. Loco 863 is now in the hands of Steamtown Peterborough, though sadly it will be restored to Mustard Pot livery and not that seen here. The 600s colour scheme when first operational was almost exactly that which 863 sports– Mustard Pot does not sit as well on them.




Outside the dual gauge Port Pirie diesel depot sits GM34, still in ex-Commonwealth Railways livery apart from the ANR lettering. Of interest to the modeller is the switch stand next to the loco displaying 'SG' lettering denoting which gauge the track was set to. Meanwhile in Pirie yard we find SAR BG shunter 517 with an unidentified 930. The 500 class remains on broad gauge to this day, and has been donated in a non operational condition to the National Railway Museum by Genesee and Wyoming.



By good fortune or design, the club trip coincided with the very last broad gauge steam train to Port Pirie, with 520 doing the honours on a packed ARHS special.



By way of contrast, here is a shot from one of the previous SARMA trips to Pirie in purely SAR days. Class leader 600 shows how maroon and silver should look at the head of a standard gauge ballast train. TREVOR CARTER






