


SARMA Clubroom layout September 2018 Dean Schluter

The scenery on the layout is progressing but it's a big layout and there are still large areas to do. Chris Mutton and Trevor Marsh are doing a great job on the scenery around the cement works and Balmoral yard (see photos below).





Since Graham Phillips has returned from his overseas trip he is doing nice work on the area below the Northern peninsula (see photo below).



At the Southern end, Gordon Chaplin is doing a good job on the scenery on the face of the peninsula. Kelvin Brinkley spent hours painting the individual stones in the embankment (see photo below).



David Jameson is modifying the Redbanks yard again! Terry Jomartz has been bolting the two Redbanks platforms in place. They were bolted as are all the platforms so they will not be damaged; it needed to be shifted. (photo below)





Because the BGB silo kits are no longer available I have purchased a Walthers American grain elevator and grossly attacked it (see overleaf) to resemble a South Australian one.



The railway car loading structure (yet to be painted) was made from brass tubing and shapes, as this was not included in the original kit.

The second round of running sessions have occurred. The second modern Australian night saw two mishaps occur, one was a derailment in Redbanks yard unfortunately killing a group of train watchers (top), the other was on the double main to Burford caused by over speed (below). ■






The Model Railway at Peterborough Post Office

Chris Woodman



This display came into being by chance. In early 2017 Chris had been thinking about designing building a model train layout based around the Peterborough railway additional yards as an tourist attraction. He had researched the topic, met with people from several model train organisations, looked at different displays and ultimately decided that it was too complex to do and essentially gave up on the idea.

In November 2017 a friend told him that he should look on Facebook because someone in Peterborough had a train set based on





Peterborough for sale. Chris decided to keep a low profile and approached owner, Jason O'Connell, on the quiet to have a look at it. It turned out that it was what Chris was after so they did a deal and the model layout was transferred to its new home. As part of the deal it was agreed that the new owners name was to be kept secret whilst it was relocated and rebuilt.

Six months later, after extensive remodelling, the model railway was opened to the public. As the model is based on the railway yards in Peterborough around 1968 it was important that it looked accurate as possible. The major setback for a is that there are not a lot of South Australian model trains buildings made in N gauge so they had to improvise.

With that in mind Chris purchased a 3D printer and used it to build over 70 buildings based on photos from the current day and







that period. Most of the buildings took from 2-4 hours to design using a software program called BlocksCAD and a further 2-6 hours to print. The biggest prints are the Silos (based on the Yongala silos) which took 13 hours to make and the Catholic Church which took 10.

The model railway is N Gauge (scale of 1:148) because it is very small and enables a lot more to be squeezed into the space available. If it had been HO (1:87) then it would have needed more than double the space for the same display.



One side is based on the Peterborough railway yards. The other side is not based on anything in particular but does have a replica of the Yongala Silos. The model trains have a big turning circle and so as to fit it into a small area the trains need to travel through "Peterborough" then through the "country side" and then back into Peterborough.


It wasn't possible to fit everything into the layout due to size restrictions so a number of streets and building have had to be omitted. It's not 100% accurate but it does give you an idea of what this section of the town was like.

Initially this display took Jason about 15,000 hours to build; Chris has spent another 1000 hours refurbishing it. It is valued at about \$20,000.

The layout is set in the period when the railways were moving from steam locomotives to diesel electric and standardisation of the railway network in Australia was about to happen. ■




















The other boat lift than the Falkirk Wheel is the Anderton Boat Lift, a two caisson lift lock near the village of Anderton in Cheshire, North West England. It provides a 15 m vertical link between the River Weaver and the Trent and Mersey Canal.

Built in 1875, the boat lift was in use for over 100 years until, due to corrosion it was closed in 1983. Restoration started in 2001 and the boat lift was re-opened in 2002. The lift and associated visitor centre and exhibition are operated by the Canal & River Trust.
